



3. **Development** of the Strategy and Implementation Plan of the institution responsible for managing the Warsaw Metropolitan Area.

- Integrated transport is the foundation for effective metropolitan planning, cooperation, and future growth.
- The public transport system in the Warsaw Metropolis is currently divided among various independent carriers and local operators.

Integrated Metropolitan Transportation System

The main points and knowledge obtained:

- Transport planning tools and instruments
- Integrated approach of transport planning and settlement development
- Regional Mobility Management (express bus lines, mobility platform, mobility hubs, bike sharing)
- Financing and budget of metropolitan transport, sharing of revenues
- Competences of Transport and Tariff Associations
- Passenger Information Systems (website, apps, signposting)
- Legal rules

Pilot action

Possibilities of Integrating Bus Transport in the Warsaw Metropolis

The pilot action was prepared drawing on best practices from the **Stuttgart** and **Berlin-Brandenburg**.

The analysis is structured into two main parts:

- **INVENTORY PART:** Describes the current state of bus transport services and outlines actions for the future integration process.
- **PLANNING PART:** Focuses on the future planning, legal frameworks, and strategies needed to implement the integration and tariff system successfully.



Cooperation platform for the development of metropolitan public transport

Is an integrated, collaborative space designed to facilitate cooperation among stakeholders involved in the planning, development, and operation of public transport systems.



Action plan

Integrated Plan for the Development and Coordination of Public Transport in the Warsaw Metropolis

- 1. Action 1: Establishing the Strategic Framework for Metropolitan Transport Governance.**
- 2. Action 2: Implementing Technical Solutions for Integrated Metropolitan Transport Systems and Services.**
- 3. Action 3: Building Metropolitan Identity and Promoting Sustainable Mobility**

The Action Plan transforms scattered local transport initiatives into a coherent, standardized system for the Warsaw Metropolis through joint planning and close collaboration among local governments. Because full integration depends on crucial state funding from the pending Metropolitan Act to relieve Warsaw's financial burden, municipalities are proactively preparing the plan now to ensure it is ready for immediate implementation the moment the new legislation is passed.
